

Our project ---> How to preserve European Linguistic Heritage through generations?

WHAT?

Merging traditional time capsule methods with digital technology to safeguard endangered European languages. Encouraging to share testimonies for a comprehensive cultural archive and fostering EU intercultural appreciation.



HOW?

Digital artifact archives: collect digital artifacts showcasing European languages and cultures.

Interactive time-capsule platform: a platform to learn about endangered languages and cultures.

Citizens participation: Encourage people to share their cultural stories and experiences digitally.

Our project --> How to preserve European Linguistic Heritage through generations?

WHY?

- Preserve European linguistic heritage with a digital time capsule for future access.
- Raise awareness and appreciation of endangered European languages and cultures.
- Strengthen cooperation among stakeholders for European language preservation.
- Analyzing contributions to understand cultural priorities and guide preservation efforts.



FUTURE STEP

Using the contents of the time-capsule to create an AR time capsule experience for users to explore virtual artifacts at real-world locations using smartphones

→ discovering hidden messages and interactive elements related to Europe's linguistic diversity, blending technology with culture for engaging audience experiences.

Europeana Foundation

Europeana is a digital platform that provides access to millions of cultural heritage items from European museums, galleries, libraries, and archives. They aggregate digital collections from cultural institutions across Europe, including photographs, artworks, manuscripts, and audiovisual materials. Europeana's digital repository serves as a virtual time capsule, preserving and showcasing Europe's cultural heritage online.




European Youth

Historical Archives of the European Union

Finally, it facilitates research on the history of the European Union, promotes public interest in European integration and enhances transparency in the functioning of EU Institutions.

DIGICHer

Digitisation of the cultural heritage of minority communities for equity and renewed engagement

The project aims to explore the legal, political, socio-economic and technological factors driving the digitisation of cultural heritage for minority groups.



SILKNOW

SILKNOW is a research project that improves the understanding, conservation and dissemination of European silk heritage from the 15th to the 19th century. It applies next-generation computing research to the needs of diverse users (museums, education, tourism, creative industries, media...), and preserves the tangible and intangible heritage associated with silk.

Jewish History Tours

This project aimed to create engaging online tours using Jewish heritage data on pan-European topics, such as multiculturalism, persecution and migration.

Jewish History Tours leveraged the power of location-based storytelling to create engaging, high-quality tours on pan-European topics, such as multiculturalism, persecution and migration.

The project aggregated and enriched a selection of around 30,000 high-quality objects from 13 new content partners to Europeana. The selected content showcases Jewish life in Europe across times and locations and serves as material for the planned 80 digital heritage tours.



Related work

Large multimedia archive for world languages.

The research paper discusses the creation and management of a multimedia archive dedicated to documenting endangered languages worldwide. It highlights the importance of preserving linguistic diversity and cultural heritage in the face of globalization.
